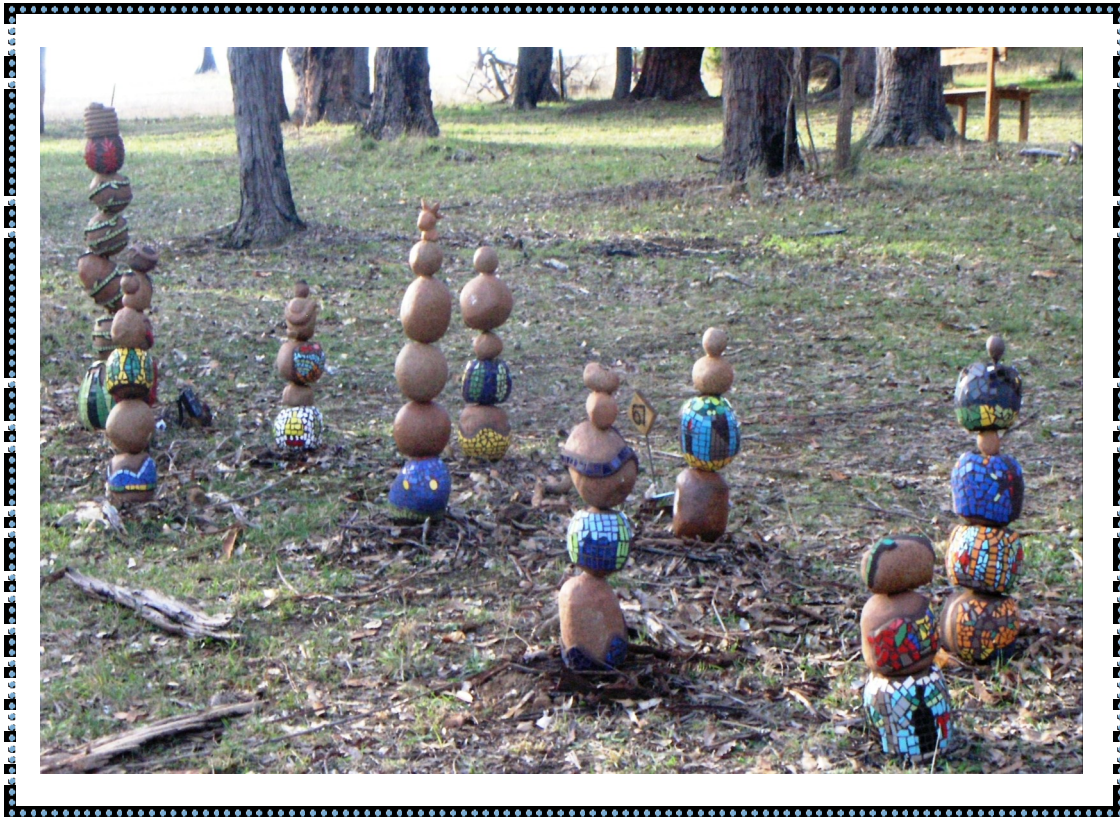
Abbey created a carefree girl from scrap metal, bits and pieces and time to show how the simplest things in life, such as flying a kite, can be memorable.
